Medication Take-Back Boxes – Disposal Guidelines

(Adapted from the PA Department of Drug and Alcohol Programs' website)

Preparing items for disposal at a Take-Back Box location

- All pharmaceutical drugs that are being disposed of need to be in a sealed container such as the original bottle or a zip-lock bag. *They may not be disposed of loosely.*
- Liquid pharmaceuticals should remain in the original container.
- Personal information should be removed or blotted out with a permanent marker.

Items Accepted

Prescription and over-the-counter solid medications, tablets and capsules, liquid medications, inhalers, creams, ointments, nasal sprays, and pet medicines*

Items NOT Accepted

Intravenous solutions, injectables and needles*

* *Please check with your drop off location for a complete list of items accepted or not accepted.*

Questions and Answers

Will people know I dropped off prescription medicine?

The program is intended to be free and anonymous. Be sure to remove any prescription labels with personal identifying information, or place the medication in a ziplock plastic bag.

What else can people do to prevent prescription drug abuse?

- Consider using a lock box or hiding your medication in a discrete location in your home so they are not easy for others to find.
- Keep track of your medicine. Count how many pills you have at any given time to check for missing pills.
- Don't share your medications.
- Keep a low profile. Your medicines are your private business. There's no reason to tell people about the medications you are taking.
- Properly dispose of old or unused medicines. If a Take-Back Program is not available, prescription drugs can be placed in a container mixed with used coffee grinds or kitty litter and thrown in the garbage.

Where can people with prescription drug addictions find help?

Under Pennsylvania law, Medicaid and most private health insurance will cover the cost of substance abuse treatment. Some funding is also available to cover the cost of treatment for people who don't have health insurance. Cumberland and Perry County residents can call the Cumberland-Perry Drug & Alcohol Commission toll free at (866) 240-6300.
