During a public meeting, the commissioners ordered the county flag be flown at half-staff until Tuesday, Jan. 18, 2021, in memory of Sandy, as a testament to her commitment and contribution to Cumberland County.

“With a heavy heart we announce the passing of our chief clerk, Sandy Moyle, who served the county for nearly seven years,” said Commissioner Gary Eichelberger. “Sandy was a remarkable woman whose dedication and commitment extended to all employees and the residents of Cumberland County.”

Moyle served as Chief Clerk since 2018, and deputy chief clerk since 2014. As chief clerk, Moyle managed the county’s day-to-day operations within the guidelines set forth by the Pennsylvania County Code and the Board of Commissioners.
