Cumberland County Native Promoted to Chief Clerk/Chief Operating Officer

Carlisle, PA – Cumberland County Commissioners today announced that Stacy Marie Snyder has been promoted to the position of Chief Clerk/Chief Operating Officer for the county. Snyder takes over after the passing of Sandy Moyle in December.

Snyder has been serving as deputy chief clerk for one year and acting chief clerk for the past seven months. As chief clerk, Snyder will manage the county's day-to-day operations within the guidelines set forth by the Pennsylvania County Code and the Board of Commissioners.

Previous to Snyder's position with the county, she served as Deputy Court Administrator of York County and a systems trainer for the Administrative Office of Pennsylvania Courts, in Mechanicsburg for 12 years. As administrator, Snyder managed the day-to-day operations for Family Court and worked on protocols and procedures for the district court administrator and board of judges.

Snyder, also a high school teacher, taught U.S. and World History. Her passion for history extended to working as a docent for James Madison's Montpelier, Virginia, where she created a teacher outreach program for continuing education credit. She has also spent 25 years researching her family history. Snyder's research uncovered much of her family history is intertwined with the history of Cumberland County.

"I am proud to live and work in Cumberland County, where many of my ancestors spent their years growing the county," said Snyder. "As chief clerk, I will continue to work with my talented colleagues and manage the daily operations for our county."

Snyder holds a Master's Degree in Secondary Education from University of Alabama, where she also earned her Bachelor of Arts Degree.
