County Treasurer Accepting Doe Applications by Mail Only, Monday, July 12

Carlisle, PA – The Cumberland County Treasurer's office will begin accepting Pennsylvania antlerless deer applications by mail only, beginning Monday, July 12. Treasurer Kelly Neiderer recommends mailing applications no earlier than Friday, July 9.

"Per the Pennsylvania Game Commission rules, resident applications received prior to Monday, July 12, will be returned to the resident, and go unprocessed," said Neiderer.

The Pennsylvania Game Commission increased the transaction fees for all hunting licenses this year by \$.07, making the price for resident antlerless deer licenses \$6.97. Applicants need to make the check payable to "County Treasurer" and include it along with their application.

All mailed antlerless deer license applications must be sent in the official pink envelope along with postage applied to the return envelope, to the Treasurer's Office, 1 Courthouse Square, Second floor, Room 201, Carlisle PA 17013. Envelopes are available in the Treasurer's Office or at other Licensing Agents. Hunters may submit only one application per round, however up to three applications can be submitted using the same envelope.

The starting dates for each round of doe licenses have been established as follows:

- Monday, July 12 – Residents
- Monday, July 19 – Non-residents
- Monday, Aug. 2 – Unsold First round
- Monday, Aug. 16 – Unsold Second Round
- Monday, Sept. 13 – Over-the-counter sales begin

A new rule from the Pennsylvania Game Commission is that hunters may now apply for and obtain up to six antlerless deer licenses before the start of the season for any Wildlife Management Unit (WMU) in which licenses remain available. Each hunter will qualify for three additional licenses at the time over-the-counter sales begin, although licenses in some WMUs may be sold out by September 13. Hunters statewide are limited to holding six unfilled antlerless deer licenses at one time. However, hunters who obtain six antlerless deer licenses may apply for additional licenses, if available, as they harvest deer and report them.
