Cumberland County Warrants Collections Holds Amnesty Week

Individuals who have failure to pay warrants can pay fines and costs with no fear of arrest, May 23 - May 27

Carlisle, PA – Individuals who have a “failure to pay warrant for your arrest”, or have failed to maintain a payment plan, may be able to qualify for the Amnesty Program scheduled for May 23 – 27, 8:30 a.m. – 3:30 p.m., through the Cumberland County Warrant Collections Unit.

To continue to improve fines, costs, and victim restitution collection rates in Cumberland County, the one-week Amnesty Event has been created so that individuals who attend can meet with county officials regarding outstanding warrants without fear of arrest.

This only applies to failure to pay cases:

- You will not be arrested and any non-payment warrant or failure to appear warrant with the collections department will be immediately dismissed if payment is made.
- You will not be required to appear in court.
- The collections office will work with individuals who still owe money and determine a reasonable payment plan.

To make payments, visit the Cumberland County Courthouse, One Courthouse Square, Carlisle, Warrant Collections Office on the 3rd floor between 8:30 a.m.- 3:30 p.m., or contact Warrant Collections, at 717.240.7340, or make your payment online at <https://uisportal.pacourts.us/> during the week of May 23 - 27, 2022.

People who have outstanding non-payment warrants and do not take advantage of the Amnesty Program will have their names and photos published on a county website, social media and/or future editions of local newspapers and television stations. The Cumberland County Warrant Collections Department will be working with various agencies to have a county-wide warrant sweep for those who have failed to contact them, after the amnesty week has concluded.
