ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER NO. CP-21-MD-20-2022

AND NOW, this 3rd day of March 2023, in consideration of the recent delays in the postal service, it is hereby ORDERED and DECREED that, effective March 3, 2023, pursuant to Pa.R.Civ.P. 1910.12(b)(2), litigants may demand a hearing before a hearing officer via electronic filing. Pursuant to Pa.R.Civ.P. 1910.12(f), litigants may file Exceptions via electronic filing. Additionally, litigants may file continuance requests in de novo support hearings via electronic filing.

If submissions are made via electronic filing, they must be attached to an email as a PDF or a JPEG and emailed to domesticrelations@cumberlandcountypa.gov. Any document filed via electronic filing must at least include the filing party's name, the case caption, and the docket number. All documents filed via electronic filing must be signed by the filing party. Failure to comply with any of the above, may result in the electronic filing being rejected.

Any submission made after 4:30 p.m. will be considered filed the next business day. The electronic filing will be printed and filed as the original document. Electronic filings are permissive and not mandatory.

The Cumberland County Court Administrator's Office shall post notice of this Order on the Cumberland County Court of Common Pleas website as soon as reasonably possible and send a copy to the Cumberland County Bar Association. The

Cumberland County Domestic Relations Office shall also post notice of this Order on its official website.
