Cumberland County Libraries Join Longwood Gardens' 2024 Community Read

Mechanicsburg, PA – Cumberland County book lovers and garden lovers are encouraged to participate in Longwood Gardens' 2024 Community Read - a program designed to encourage reading for pleasure and to start a conversation surrounding gardens, plants, and nature.

To celebrate the eleventh year of the Community Read, readers can experience the inspiration and meaning found in the beauty of gardens. The 2024 selections include the featured book, *The Last Garden in England* by Julia Kelly. Just as Longwood Gardens has brought beauty to the lives of generations, so too does Highbury House—whose lovely gardens are at the center of this historical fiction spanning three generations. For younger readers, the selection is *The Secret Garden*, based on the novel by Frances Hodgson Burnett, adapted by Calista Brill, and illustrated by Adeline Lirius. This is a beautifully illustrated, condensed picture-book version of the classic children's novel.

"This year's books focus on the meaning and solace we can all find in gardens using historical fiction and an adaptation of a childhood classic to take us there."
