Cumberland County Asks: What Do You Think of Our County Facilities?

Carlisle, PA – If you have ever visited a Cumberland County government office or department, we want to hear from you. Cumberland County has launched a Facilities Master Plan (FMP) Survey to gather feedback from residents regarding their experiences and suggestions for improvements.

“We are currently evaluating the county’s space needs and options and are looking to residents for their insights,” said Kirk Stoner, director of planning. “The county’s primary responsibility is to provide efficient and cost-effective services to our residents and customers. The facilities master plan provides those key stakeholders the opportunity to tell us how we can best serve their needs.”

The study’s result will identify options for the county to address the space needed to support future operations, by the renovation of existing buildings, expansion of existing buildings, consolidation of facilities, leasing new space, or constructing new facilities on an appropriate site within the county.

“This is a once in a generation project that assesses county needs until 2050,” added Stoner.

Noelker and Hull, CGL Companies, and OnPointe Insights are the consultants that were selected by the Board of Commissioners to evaluate the county’s space needs and propose strategies for better operations now and into the future.

The consulting team has met with every department and toured county facilities in advance of developing projections on how much space will be needed in the future and the best alternatives to meet those needs. The study is expected to be completed in early 2025 at a total cost of \$478,789.
