## Cumberland County Public Libraries Become FamilySearch Affiliates

**Mechanicsburg, PA**—Genealogy enthusiasts who are searching for their ancestry now can find more information on their family tree at all of Cumberland County’s public libraries. The libraries have access to more genealogy resources to help you make more family discoveries with the help of FamilySearch, a world leader in family history.

“We are thrilled to be able to bring this enhanced ancestry search program to Cumberland County. We can’t wait for our patrons to start digging into their family’s – and extended families’ – rich genealogical history,” said Carolyn Blatchley, Cumberland County Library System Executive Director.

In addition to online training, and access to other libraries, there are approximately 400 million images that are currently not available to the public outside of an affiliate library or a FamilySearch center.

“Whether our library visitors begin building their family tree at home or at their library, as they find these historical images only available at the library, they can add the images to their tree. When they go home, they can continue growing their family tree,” added Blatchley.

There are only a few hundred affiliate libraries in the country. The designation means local library patrons will now have greater and more convenient access to the wealth of genealogical resources available through FamilySearch. The popular web service has over 6 billion searchable names and 2 billion images of historical genealogical records—and you get the helpful assistance of library staff.

FamilySearch adds over 300 million free genealogical records and images online yearly from all over the world and manages the famous FamilySearch Library in Salt Lake City. FamilySearch has amassed billions of birth, marriage, death, census, land, and court records from more than 130 countries to help you discover and make family connections.

“Interest in our ancestral roots continues to grow with the popularity of DNA tests, reality TV shows like Long Lost Family or Who Do You Think You Are?, and the growing access to online genealogy records. Adding the member libraries of the Cumberland County Library System as our newest FamilySearch Affiliates will enable patrons to make many fun, personal discoveries, and family connections,” said Paul Nauta, FamilySearch Public Relations Manager.
