Cumberland County to Begin Casey-McCormick Recount Wednesday, Nov. 20, at 8 a.m.

Carlisle, PA – The Cumberland County Bureau of Elections will begin a recount of ballots for the United States Senate seat on Wednesday, Nov. 20, at 8 a.m. and will continue each day until the recount is completed.

The Pennsylvania Department of State announced a statewide recount because vote totals in the U.S. Senate race between incumbent U.S. Senator Bob Casey and Dave McCormick are within a 0.5% margin, which triggers a statewide recount under Pennsylvania Law.

Once all 149,754 ballots—including those cast on Election Day, by mail, and provisionally — have been recounted, the unofficial results will be posted on the Cumberland County [Bureau of Elections website](#). Mail-in and precinct results will be recounted on different devices as specified by the Pennsylvania Department of State.

Breakdown of ballots to be recounted:

- Election Day - 105,632
- Mail Ballots - 43,223
- Provisional - 899

The candidate or their attorney, and two representatives from the Democrat and Republican parties are permitted to witness the count.

The recount of ballots will be held at the Cumberland County Bureau of Elections, 1601 Ritner Highway, Suite 201, Carlisle, PA.
