### Cumberland County Recount of United States Senate Seat Completed

**Carlisle, PA** – The Cumberland County Bureau of Elections today completed the recount for the United States Senate Seat.

All 149,754 ballots—including those cast on Election Day, by mail and provisional ballots—have been recounted. Once the unofficial results are certified by the Cumberland County Board of Elections on Monday, Nov.26, the results will be on the Cumberland County [Bureau of Elections website](https://www.cumberlandcountypa.gov/bureauofelections).

The results of the recount do not become official until certified by the PA Department of State.

The Cumberland County Board of Elections today praised the work of everyone who was involved in the election process over the past several months:
