Cumberland County to Conduct First Mosquito Control Spray of 2025

Mosquito Spraying Scheduled for June 18-19 Due to High Mosquito Populations

Carlisle, PA – Cumberland County will conduct its first adult mosquito control spray of 2025 on Wednesday, June 18, and Thursday, June 19, from dusk to 11 p.m. The spraying is part of the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection's Mosquito-Borne Disease Control Program (MDC) and is being conducted due to high mosquito populations caused by standing water from recent storms.

Spraying will take place in parts of the following eight Cumberland County municipalities:

- Carlisle and Mount Holly Springs Boroughs
- Dickinson, Monroe, Penn, Southampton, South Middleton, and South Newton Townships

To date, there have been no positive West Nile Virus samples identified for the season.

Residents can help reduce mosquito populations by eliminating stagnant water on their property and by treating water sources that cannot be drained with mosquito dunks or bits that contain *Bacillus thuringiensis israelensis* (Bti).

The county's West Nile Virus program utilizes an Integrated Pest Management (IPM) Plan which controls mosquitoes, while limiting health risks and protecting the environment. The county will continue to monitor mosquito populations and treat water habitats.
