




## Agriculture Fast Facts:

- Over 70% of agriculture related products in Cumberland County come from livestock and poultry.
- Cumberland County ranks 8th in the state for total agriculture production, 10th for crops, and 7th for livestock and poultry.
- The total value of Cumberland County's agricultural sales is more than \$300 million.
- Pennsylvania is considered the "Snack Food Capital of the World," generating more than \$5.1 billion in sales annually for an array of snack foods.
- The Commonwealth leads the U.S. in mushroom production, annually producing more than 465 million pounds, valued at more than \$530 million per year.
- Pennsylvania ranks number one in the U.S. for hardwood exports, accounting for nearly \$1.1 billion of the state's many exports.

## Preservation Stats:

- In Cumberland County, approximately 25,000 acres of prime farmland across 225 farms are protected.
- Pennsylvania is a national leader in farmland preservation.
- The Commonwealth has preserved more than 6,400 farms, permanently protecting more than 645,000 acres of farmland statewide.




## Why Support Farmland Preservation?

- Farmland is an irreplaceable natural resource. The United States loses 2,000 acres of farmland a day to development.
- Local farms provide fresh food at a reasonable cost.
- Well managed farms benefit the environment by providing wildlife habitat and groundwater recharge.
- Farms and agriculturally related businesses support the local economy.
- Protecting local farmland helps keep property taxes down.
- Preserved farmland protects rural character and promotes local tourism. Scenic landscapes are important for attracting visitors and keeping quality of life high for local citizens.



## What Is Our Goal:

The Board of Commissioners enacted Resolution 2019-30 setting forth a policy goal of **preservation of 30,000 acres of working farmland by the year 2030**. The resolution acknowledges the importance of the agricultural industry, strong public support for farmland preservation and the need to establish a long term budgetary policy for the Program.



## Benefits of Giving:

- 100% of your donation goes to preservation of prime farmland. No funds are used for administrative purposes.
