Cumberland County Calls on Residents to Help Shape its 5-year Strategic Plan

Residents have until Friday, Oct. 10 to provide their input on the Cumberland County Strategic Plan

Carlisle, PA – Cumberland County government asks residents for input as it develops an updated 5-year strategic plan. This plan will serve as a long-term road map that defines the county's future priorities.

The strategic plan will align government services, resources, and efforts to address critical community issues identified through stakeholder engagement and suggest ways to measure progress toward long-term objectives.

"Developing a strategic plan is the first step toward building a long-term vision for both our government and the people we serve," said Cumberland County Commissioner Jean Foschi. "We're asking our residents and stakeholders to actively participate in this process so we can set clear, shared goals that will guide the county's future, growth, and success."

As Cumberland County works to define its mission, vision, priorities, and goals for the new strategic plan, community input is essential. Resident feedback will help ensure the plan reflects what matters most to the county's more than 275,000 residents.

Those interested in sharing their perspectives are encouraged to complete the Strategic Planning Survey by Friday, Oct. 10.
