Bridge Road to Close for Bridge Repairs on Monday, Oct. 27

Bridge Road in East Pennsboro Township Will be Closed Oct. 27 Through Nov. 24 for Essential Bridge Repairs and Maintenance

Carlisle, PA – Bridge Road in East Pennsboro Township, Cumberland County, will close to vehicle and pedestrian traffic on Monday, Oct. 27, for repairs and maintenance work on the county-owned bridge. The closure will remain in place through Monday, Nov. 24, 2025, while crews complete debris removal, guide rail improvements, vegetation clearing, and structural repairs to the bridge's deck, piers, and beams.

The bridge, which carries approximately 800 vehicles each day across the Conodoguinet Creek, connects Magaro Road with Country Club Road.

Advance notice signage will be posted at the bridge beginning Monday, Oct. 13. A signed detour will be in place directing motorists along Country Club Road, Route 11/15, 21st Street, Center Street, East Penn Drive, and Magaro Road.

Cumberland County owns 28 bridges, including nine shared with York County and 11 that span the Conodoguinet Creek.

The bridge project is part of a \$342,223 maintenance package that includes work on other county bridges. JDI Site Solutions from Adams County will serve as the contractor, with Herbert, Rowland & Grubic, Inc. acting as the county's bridge engineer.

This maintenance project is part of the county's ongoing Bridge Capital Improvement Program (CIP), a multiyear investment strategy to repair and replace the county's 28 bridges. Proactive repairs help ensure safe public use and prevent the need for load restrictions or permanent closures caused by deferred maintenance.

The CIP is funded primarily through the \$5 vehicle registration fee adopted in 2015, which generates about \$1.1 million annually to address critical bridge needs.
